Training Description

This introductory training will present some of the basic concepts of NMT™, a model of child trauma assessment that incorporates principles of treatment consistent with neuro-developmental needs of children impacted by developmental trauma. It’s an emerging evidence-based practice that’s rapidly growing in use as a learning model / heuristic for building clinical capacity for effective trauma informed care. It identifies approaches to working with youth and families based on a comprehensive and integrated understanding of neurobiology and child development.

This workshop will benefit mental health clinicians, health care professionals, and educators. This training is targeted towards advanced, intermediate, and beginner practitioners.
